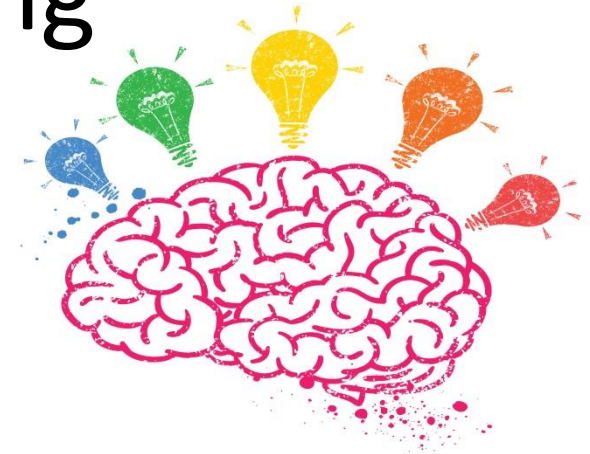

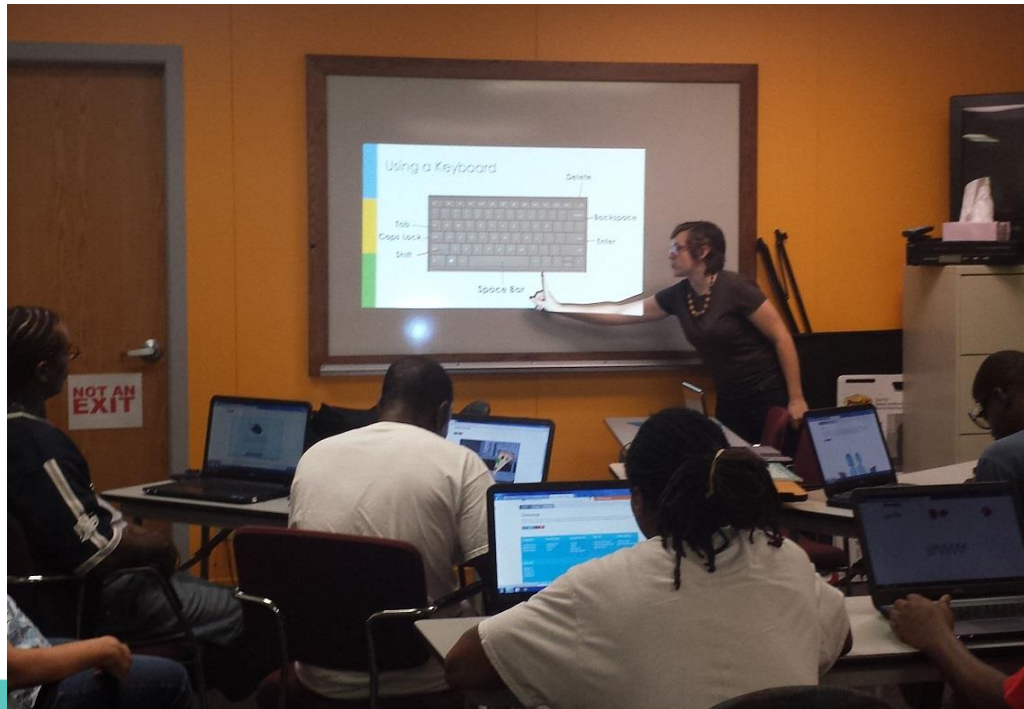

- Incentives: Getting hardware into student homes and teaching them strategies for access



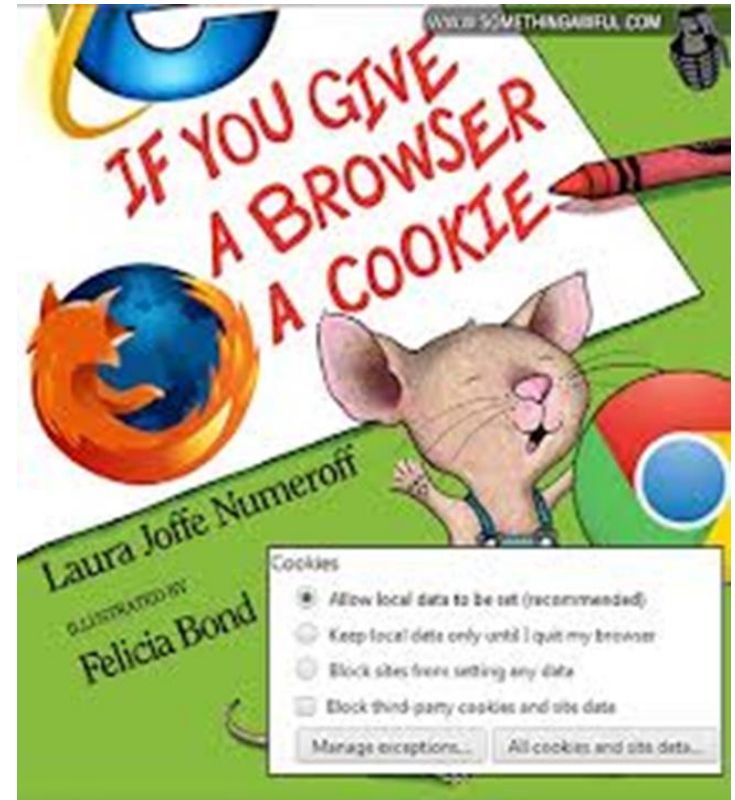
Learning Opportunities
